Dear Kim,

Leadership for Seattle Park and Recreation's (SPR) Green Lake Community Center (GLCC) have identified pathways for the Green Lake Table Tennis Club (GLTTC) to secure additional access to the GLCC facility for the purposes of table tennis both within and outside of our published public hours. You have declined these offers. To provide a brief recap please see the attached <u>timeline</u>. We have provided the following options, which you have declined to pursue:

- Rental Agreement
- Service Agreement
- Grant options via Recreation for All/Get Moving
- Adding public drop-in hours on Saturday (excluding basketball season) during our operating hours
- Creation of a table tennis league to operate on Saturdays during public hours

GLCC, in an effort to provide the general public access to the facility to enjoy free table tennis play, will set the following schedule:

Winter Quarter 2024*

Tuesdays: 6 to 8:45 p.m.

Wednesdays: 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Spring Quarter 2024

Tuesdays: 6 to 8:45 p.m.

Wednesdays: 10 a.m. to −1 p.m.

Fridays: 2:30 to 5:30 p.m.

Summer Quarter 2024*

Tuesdays: 6 to 8:45 p.m.

Fall Quarter 2024

Tuesdays: 6 to 8:45 p.m.

Wednesdays: 10am to −1 p.m. Fridays: 2:30 to 5:30 p.m.

Members of the public, including GLTTC, are welcome to access our facility, and its activities during those free-play opportunities (listed above). GLTTC may not utilize the free-play opportunities to offer leagues or set forth conditions of participation that are contrary to our activity model. This includes any QR codes that are conditions of participation. All drop-in free play activities only require a free, SPR membership card or sign-in to participate.

Lastly, we are again formally requesting that the GLTTC discontinue publishing the GLCC's mailing address and phone number on the GLTTC website as we have no formal rental agreement in place and should not be presented as the business address for the GLTTC as it is not an entity within SPR and should not be presented as such. We welcome you sharing the drop-in, free-play schedule listed above as an opportunity for all table tennis players to take advantage of our offerings.
